

Geothermal at the Library

The big news for 2015 was that the library decided to get a new geothermal HVAC system to replace its aging steam heating system. The library was one of only two buildings left on the city's steam heating system and the heating equipment in our building was old and in poor condition.

The geothermal system allows for much more consistent heating throughout the Bacon House and the main library addition. There is now central air in the Bacon House as well, allowing the library to get rid of a number of inefficient window air conditioning units. This new system has also allowed the library to get rid of its annual heating bill, which in last fiscal year, amounted to \$21,707.44.

Funds for the system came from a number of sources. The library received a grant for 42% of the overall project cost from the Wyandotte Municipal Services' grant that they received from the Department of Energy. Additionally, Wyandotte Municipal Services donated \$50,000 to the library through their energy optimization program and assisted in upgrading the library's electrical system. Municipal Services also provided the library with a 70 month no-interest loan. The remainder of the funds for the project came out of the library's fund balance.

The **Friends of Bacon Library** are an integral part of library operations. The funds they raise through memberships and fundraisers are utilized to augment the library's services and enhance the library buildings.


The Friends have been putting aside money for several years to purchase an electronic sign for the library and this year the Friends finally had enough money to purchase the sign. Thanks also to George Gouth and the Wyandotte Historical Society who both donated money for the sign. The Friends also funded both the youth and adult summer reading programs.

205 books were distributed to community gathering places such as coffee houses and waiting rooms through the Take This Book Program.
